Director Highlights

In April, Administration presented three files to Municipal Planning Commission, S24-007 for the creation of one (1) lot of approximately 4.04 hectares (10 acres) as the first parcel out, S24-009 for the creation of one (1) parcel with variance for a parcel size of approximately 9.2 hectares (22.7 acres) as Farmstead Separation within the parcel and S25-001 to create one (1) parcel with variance for a parcel size of approximately 9.89 hectares (24.4 acres) within the parcel and issued subsequent Notice of Approvals for each. Administration presented two (2) policies to the Policy Review Committee in April for Policy 6008 Licencing Undeveloped Road Allowance and Policy 6002 Development Enforcement and presented one (1) request for time extension for subdivision to Regular Council meeting.

Permit approvals issued included Notices of Decision for D24-033 a residential development within Cozy Cove, D24-169 single detached dwelling, D25-021 cabin, D25-026 existing garden suite and removal of caveat on title, D25-031 cabin, D25-033 dwelling unit modular, D25-034 dwelling unit addition, D25-038 dwelling unit modular, and staff worked with applicants on D25-044 along with an issued Letter of Compliance to bring the development into compliance for a local Shooting Range.

E25-001 warning letter received no response, and a Stop Order as per the letter was issued on April 14. Administration reached out to the applicant, who has agreed to provide an update mid May as to the status of work occurring on site to bring the parcel into compliance with the approved development permits. E24-005 has been determined to be remediated and cleaned up to the satisfaction of administration and the file in relation to court proceedings, in conversation

with legal counsel, will be closed. Several inquiries were received this month regarding subdividing properties and parcel consolidations, development permit applications, removal of caveats on title, and outstanding items on subdivision applications awaiting endorsement.

File Review and RFD preparations for seven files scheduled for MPC hearing May 14th include: S25-003 subdivision FPO, S25-005 subdivision FPO, D25-020 Home Occupation Major, D25-045 Dwelling Unit Modular, D25-062 Accessory Building, D25-065 Trucking Business and D25-075 for a Detached Suite.

Monthly highlights for GIS include creation of a Grande Cache Airport map, a Detour Bridge Map, replacement of the Valleyview Tourist centre map, added Grande Cache and Grovedale Burial sites, held map review and spring maps discussions, and produced various owner location mapping requests for RFD presentations. Monthly Land Titles changes were completed for April 2025 updates. Review of Catalis changes in Web map for Water and Sanitary lines, Grande Cache ATCO Electrical Services map, Drainage maps Road Ditching maps was also conducted. Administration attended the RFD Review Committee Meeting and the SLT Meeting held at FCSS. GIS Staff attended the Q1 joint Health and Safety committee meeting.

Land Use Bylaw (LUB) Update

Planning & Development completed review and editing of the draft Land Use Bylaw, and associated mapping. The Land Use Bylaw draft will be presented to the Council upon direction from SLT regarding the next steps.

Area Structure Plans

Public engagement in the form of open houses for the Grovedale ASP are scheduled to take place Thursday May 22, Friday May 23 & Saturday May 24th in Grovedale at the Arena. Mail drops, posters and communications materials are being prepared by Greenview staff through collaboration between Communications and Planning.

- **Governance – Improve intermunicipal government relations. Build relationships with industry focused organizations:**

Administration hosted a meeting with Beirsto & Associates regarding the proposed concept plan and development for the proposed Minor ASP amendment and future proposed subdivision at the Narrows, with the potential to be applied for in 2025 and a pre-application meeting with UFA to discuss plans for a Bulk Fuel Station in proximity to highway 40 near Grovedale. Staff hosted the quarterly meeting with Alberta Transportation in Valleyview to discuss current and upcoming projects. GIS staff provided information for Grande Cache RV Storage site updates to the Northern Gateway regarding bus routes data and reached out to Peace Wapiti for updates to their mapping data.

- **Governance - Increase staff success. Provide current staff growth opportunities when appropriate & Incorporate staff succession planning:**

In April, Administration attended the three-day in-house ICS 300 Course training held in Valleyview, attended the CPAA conference, attended the Upper Smoky Sub-Regional Plan engagement session, and volunteered at the Mock Evacuation Exercise for FCSS training. Staff began a new term of ALUP courses through the University of Alberta and completed AMHSA and e-compliance training as assigned. Staff have been covering the vacant roles of Development Technician and Development Officer while two vacancies exist. Offers have been extended and are pending acceptance for the Development Officer and Development Technician positions, with the hope to fill these positions shortly.

The administration conducted six site visits for application files under review in April, four for subdivision applications and two development permits.

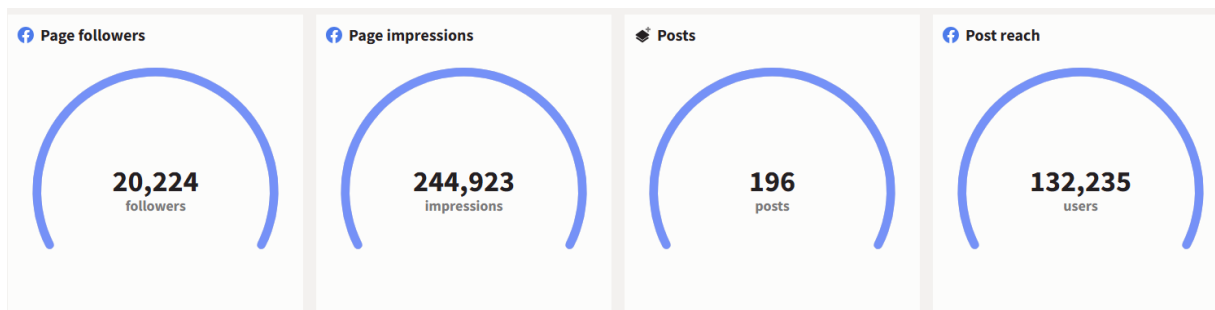

The Work NW Committee has convened and successfully approved the strategic plan for 2025. This plan includes a comprehensive marketing strategy, and the hiring of a Work Integrated Learning Specialist hired through Northwestern Polytechnic who will collaborate closely with both students and local businesses to enhance opportunities for practical experience. To support this initiative, several sub-committees have been established to focus on specific areas of the strategy. Additionally, the committee is scheduling awareness presentations with local associations to ensure that all stakeholders are informed and can participate actively in this endeavor. These efforts aim to foster stronger connections between our educational programs and the local community, promoting mutual growth and success.

Economic Development attended the annual EDA Xperience 2025 Summit and Conference (Economic Developers Alberta) from April 9–11. Over three days, participants engaged in informative sessions, explored the latest economic development trends, networked with industry peers, and enjoyed a standout presentation by the O’Leary Group.

Greenview, together with the County of Grande Prairie and the City of Grande Prairie, was honored with **three major awards** for their collaborative efforts:

- **The Alex Metcalfe Award – Best in Show (Large Community/Region)** for *Work Northwest Alberta*.

Our Economic Development team attended the Canadian Hydrogen Convention in Edmonton on April 22-24 as part of Invest Northwest (Invest NW), alongside the County of Grande Prairie and the City of Grande Prairie. The convention, held in Edmonton, is Canada’s largest event focused on the role of hydrogen in reaching net-zero emissions by 2050. It brings together industry leaders, governments, and Indigenous partners to advance hydrogen technologies, infrastructure, and policy. The event features exhibitions, conferences, and networking opportunities that promote innovation and collaboration.

In collaboration with Northwestern Polytechnic, Economic Development has three students continuing work on the pre-feasibility study for the Eco Agricultural Industrial Park that is slated to be complete on September 24th.

- **Economy – Create a diverse economy. Create opportunities to support and attract businesses in Greenview:**

The E Ventures Advisory Committee has identified a promising opportunity to advance the development of an electric vehicle (EV) charging network within the region. After careful evaluation, the committee has found a potential partner in, a company that recently secured funding through the Natural Resources Canada (NRCan) Zero Emissions Vehicle Infrastructure Program (ZEVIP). This federal funding aims to support the deployment of EV charging stations across Canada, aligning well with Greenview’s sustainability goals and transportation initiatives.

The partner has expressed interest in expanding its infrastructure into the Greenview region and has specifically identified the communities of Valleyview and Grande Cache as strategic locations for EV charger installations. These sites were likely chosen based on factors such as highway accessibility, current traffic volumes, and future growth potential in EV usage.

In support of this initiative, a formal proposal and lease agreement are currently being developed by the partner. These documents will outline the terms and logistics for site access, installation, and ongoing operation of the charging stations. Once finalized, the proposal will be submitted to the Municipal District of Greenview for review, with the intent of entering into a collaborative agreement that supports long-term infrastructure development and regional climate goals.

- **Economy – Create a diverse economy. Create opportunities to support and attract businesses in Greenview:**

Economic Development participated in a recent job fair hosted by the Grande Cache Community Learning and Employment Centre, demonstrating its ongoing commitment to supporting local employment initiatives and workforce development. Although the event featured a modest number of employer booths—just five in total—it drew an encouraging turnout of 55 attendees, reflecting a strong interest in employment opportunities within the community. The event provided a valuable platform for job seekers to connect directly with potential employers, gain insights into available positions, and explore career pathways. Building on the success of this initiative, Economic Development will continue to collaborate closely with the Grande Cache Community Learning and Employment Centre to coordinate and promote future job fairs in the hamlet of Grande Cache. These efforts aim to strengthen local employment prospects, support businesses in their recruitment efforts, and contribute to the long-term economic vitality of the region.

- **Culture, Social & Emergency Services – Improve public perception of Greenview. *Actively participate in community events:***

Planning efforts for the Wildcraft Bush Festival have been placed on hold as organizers reassess the project's logistics and overall readiness. Several contributing factors have led to the decision to postpone the event until 2026. These include the need for significant site improvements to ensure safety and accessibility, securing adequate funding to support festival operations and programming, and aligning timelines with key milestones in the planning process.

Additionally, the evolving role and involvement of partnering non-profit organizations have played a critical role in the decision-making as it became clear the financial risk model was no longer in their interest to proceed in 2025. Taking this additional time will allow the organizing team to strengthen partnerships, refine the event vision, and ultimately deliver a more impactful and sustainable festival experience in the future.

- **Culture, Social & Emergency Services – Improve public perception of Greenview. *Actively participate in community events:***

The Grande Cache Heritage Rendezvous, supported by the Grande Cache Chamber, is an annual festival celebrating the unique culture and history of Grande Cache. Both the Rendezvous Committee and the Chamber of Commerce presented at the Committee of the Whole for funding of the festival to take place on June 27-29.

- **Culture, Social & Emergency Services – Improve public perception of Greenview. *Actively participate in community events:***

On April 6, 2025, the Grande Cache Tourism & Interpretive Centre proudly hosted its annual Easter Egg Event, bringing the community together for a festive family fun day. The event was a tremendous success, attracting approximately 250 enthusiastic participants of all ages. To enhance the experience, the Tourism & Interpretive Centre partnered with the Grande Cache Recreation Centre, the Municipal Library, and the B.E.S.T. (Building Effective Skills Together) Program, creating a truly collaborative and memorable occasion.

Families were invited to participate in a lively Easter egg hunt, featuring colorful hidden treasures scattered throughout the grounds, sparking excitement and adventure among the children. In addition to the hunt, attendees enjoyed a variety of festive activities, including crafting Easter-themed creations, savoring a selection of treats, and gathering for a special

Easter story time session hosted by the Municipal Library. A highlight of the day was a cheerful visit from the Easter Bunny, who delighted children and families alike, offering opportunities for photos and memorable interactions.

Overall, the event fostered a strong sense of community spirit, providing a welcoming space for families to celebrate the holiday together and creating lasting memories for all who attended.

Grande Cache Tourism & Interpretive Centre

- **Culture, Social & Emergency Services – Improve public perception of Greenview.**

The Grande Cache Tourism & Interpretive Centre is undergoing several maintenance and safety improvements to enhance the experience for visitors. The garden area at the front of the building has been cleaned up, creating a more welcoming entrance. As part of the updates, large rocks that were previously in the garden have been removed and thoughtfully placed around the facility to improve both appearance and function. To address safety concerns, especially with vehicles speeding through the parking lot, a "slow down" sign will be installed at the main entrance to encourage drivers to reduce their speed and watch for pedestrians.

In addition, the brick pathway leading to the Centre has been temporarily closed. This decision was made due to loose bricks and uneven ground, which could pose a tripping hazard. The closure ensures the safety of all visitors while the pathway is assessed for repairs. Inside the Centre, the walls and ceiling on the main floor have been freshly painted, brightening up the space and giving it a clean, refreshed look. These ongoing improvements reflect the Centre's commitment to providing a safe, inviting, and well-maintained environment for everyone to enjoy.

An update on the Greenview-Valleyview & Area Tourist Information Centre outlines several ongoing and upcoming projects. Roofing contractors replaced the singles between April 23–25, following the delivery of materials on April 22. Sewer tank inspections for both the RV dumping station and the washroom facilities took place on April 25. Plastic lumber to refurbish nine picnic tables and one bench arrived on April 28 with Facilities & Maintenance Team completing the work. Additionally, Facilities and Maintenance will replace outdated outdoor signs, in collaboration with the Chamber of Commerce and Town of Valleyview, and will install a new M.D. of Greenview Tourism map produced by the GIS team.
